Be the Change!



This has been quite a year for our world. As Rockford Sexual Assault Counseling (RSAC) has been working to maintain as much normalcy as we can with our services during these dark times, we look ahead to the light that our 2nd annual Dispelling the Darkness candlelight vigil can bring to survivors of sexual assault/abuse. Why is this vigil so important? It's a time where we can come together publicly to say to survivors that we support them as a community. Sexual assault and abuse survivors need to feel seen and heard by those in their lives and communities. You have a survivor in your life whether you know it yet or not, and the importance of feeling safe and supported by loved ones is so crucial. When they see that you have posted on social media that you have lit a candle in support of survivors, they know you are a safe person to disclose to if needed! While it might make you nervous to think about someone disclosing sexual assault/abuse to you, please remember you don't have to be a professional to help them!

Listen... without interrupting or questioning their disclosure.

Support... "I believe you", "I'm sorry this happened to you", "How can I help you?"

Refer... "RSAC provides free counseling, legal advocacy, and medical advocacy. I can get you their phone number or you can visit their website for more information if you want"

Don't...pressure them to do anything they're not ready for! Remember that telling you was a huge step in starting their healing process!

The candlelight vigil also serves another purpose. When you light that candle, it is a message to perpetrators that our community does not tolerate sexual violence of any type. Every time you share a post from our Facebook page, you are sending that message, too. Please join us as we continue the work of supporting sexual assault/abuse survivors by lighting a candle in their honor. I also encourage you to think past the vigil to how you can help be the change in our community for survivors of sexual assault and abuse. Whether that's volunteering, posting support for survivors on social media, or committing to being a good listener, we can all help to make a difference!

Rockford Sexual Assault Counseling, Inc. recruits volunteers to provide advocacy for victims of sexual assault or abuse and their families. Volunteers play an important role in helping victims feel they are not alone and not to blame for the assault or abuse.

Our agency provides a 40-hour training session for all volunteers. The topics discussed will include, but are not limited to: basic advocacy techniques, the Illinois Criminal Sexual Assault Law, medical care of the victim, crisis intervention, child sexual abuse, and community resources. Volunteers providing advocacy play a crucial role in providing crisis intervention services to victims of assault or abuse.

Requirements for becoming an RSAC volunteer:

- At least 18 years old
- Background check
- Available for on call two weekday evenings a month or one weekend day a month
- Have reliable transportation with insurance
- Have a phone

Fee for training class is \$40 to cover materials.

Scholarships are available.
