We welcome volunteers from any of our 3 county service areas!

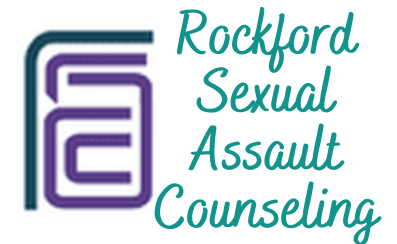

Volunteer Advocate

Volunteer Advocates play a crucial role in providing crisis intervention services to recent victims of sexual violence.

Volunteers are responsible for:

- Responding to local emergency rooms after a sexual assault has occurred.
- Responding to the 24-Hour crisis hotline if the caller is not a current client.
- Maintaining client confidentiality.

Volunteers must:

- Complete 40-hour training*
- Be 18 years of age.
- Be available at least 2 days a month
- Have a phone and transportation.
- Quarterly support meetings are not required, but offered

40-Hour Training

Volunteer Advocates must receive 40-hour training.

Topics will include:

- Rape Trauma Syndrome
- Mandated Reporting
- Crisis Advocacy Skills
- Domestic Violence
- Illinois Criminal Sexual Assault Laws
- Hospital Procedures

*\$40 fee (scholarships are available)
